


Priti Mahesh, Toxics Link

Delhi

- Delhi -most polluted city in the world (air quality)
- Air pollution causes the death of about
 10,500 people in Delhi every year
- Increase in respiratory and other pollution related diseases
- •Health impacts from prolonged exposure to environmental pollution


Search for Potential Hotspots...


- 51 sites were shortlisted and assessed
- Factors considered
 - Industrial Process
 - Use of Chemicals
 - Discharge and Emissions (Air/Water/Soil)
 - Disposal Technique
 - Occupational Health and Safety
- Based on field survey and interviews
- Mix of authorized and non authorized industrial areas

Shocking or Expected?

Unaccepted Realities

- 18 probable hotspots
- More than 7000 units located in these area
- Around 1.5 lakh employed
- Spread
- Violation of Land use norms
- Illegal operations



- Operational in residential colonies or villages
- Hazardous processes
- Careless use of chemicals
- Open burning and dumping of waste or spent chemicals
- Zero environmental norms
- Air, water and soil contamination
- Vulnerable population employed
- No occupational & health safety measures
- Low wages

Prem Nagar

- Lead Acid Battery recycling
- More than 100 units in the area
- Crude furnaces to recover the metal
- •Lead plates melted...no control on toxic fumes and ash
- Workers with no PPE
- Proximity to residential area

Acidic in Nature

Wazirpur

- One of the dirtiest area
- More than 1000 units
- Pickling is the main business
- Concentrated acids used in operation
- Unventilated spaces- acid fumes, breathing problems
- Low quality PPE

Moti Nagar

- CFL assembly and reassembly
- More than 1000 units
- Residential area- household industry
- Women and children employed
- Breakage- concerns on mercury release
- Dumping with MSW


Old Seelampur, Shastri Park, Gokulpuri...

- E-waste dismantling and handling
- CRT regunning
- More than 500 units
- Women and teenage boys employed
- Blow torch- lead fumes
- Non- recyclables dumped

Waste Unlimited

- 3 landfills
- Overburdened
- No leachate collection system- leading to Groundwater contamination
- Ragpickers scavenging through wasteinhuman conditions
- 16 Closed landfill sites- Tests, Remediation?
- GHGs



Concerns from Past

- Fly ash dumping sites in Delhi Buradi, Sarai
 Kale khan, Millenium Bus depot etc.
- Chemical Market
- Yamuna
- Historical or legacy sites
 - > Brick kiln
 - > Stone crushing: Badapur, LalKuan etc.
 - > Chemical manufacturing: Zakhira
 - > Cement manufacturing unit: Okhla
- No study on contamination levels
- No remediation action taken

Open secret

- Operations increasing
- Spreading to neighbouring areas
- No action

Lack of Planning/ Lack of Resources/Corruption???

Hurdles

- Not much work in this area
- Many hidden locations- hard to find information
- Unit owners and workers not willing to share information or concerns
- Formal industrial areas and association not forthcoming
